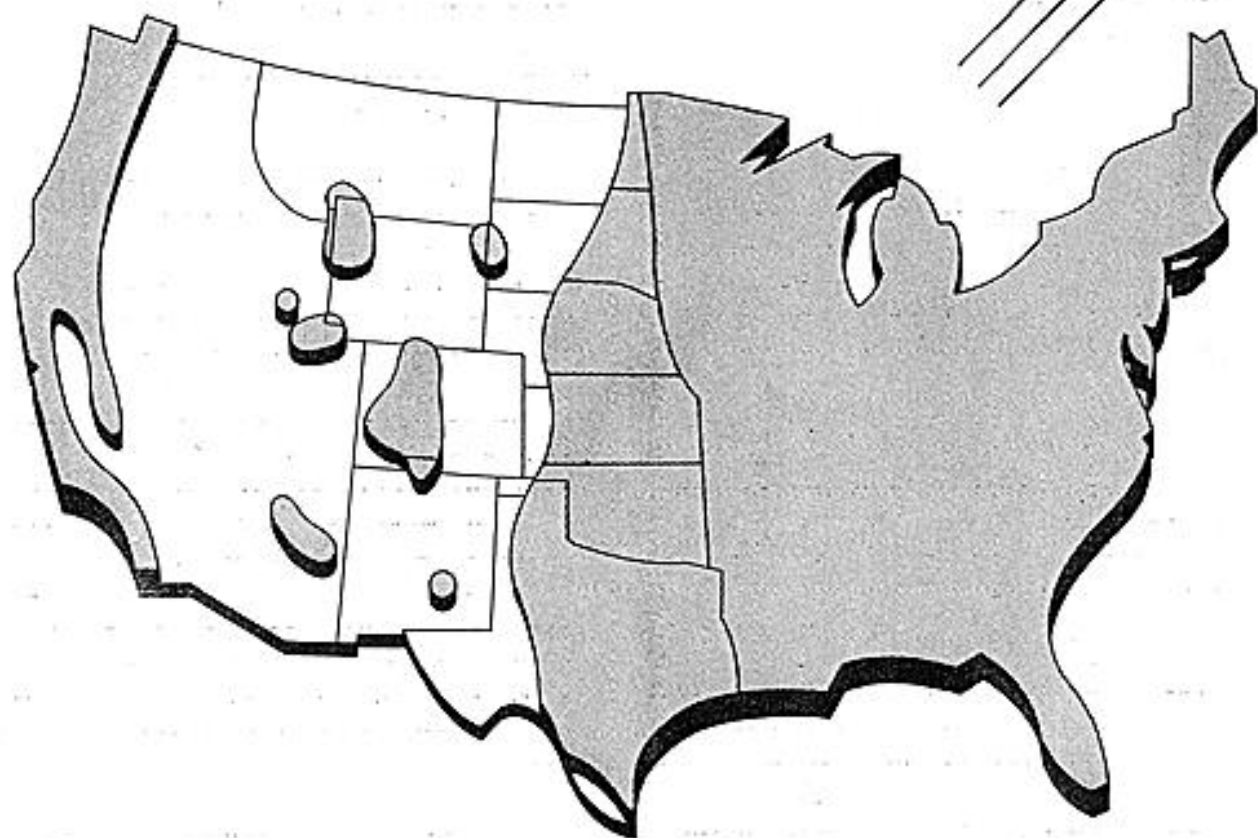

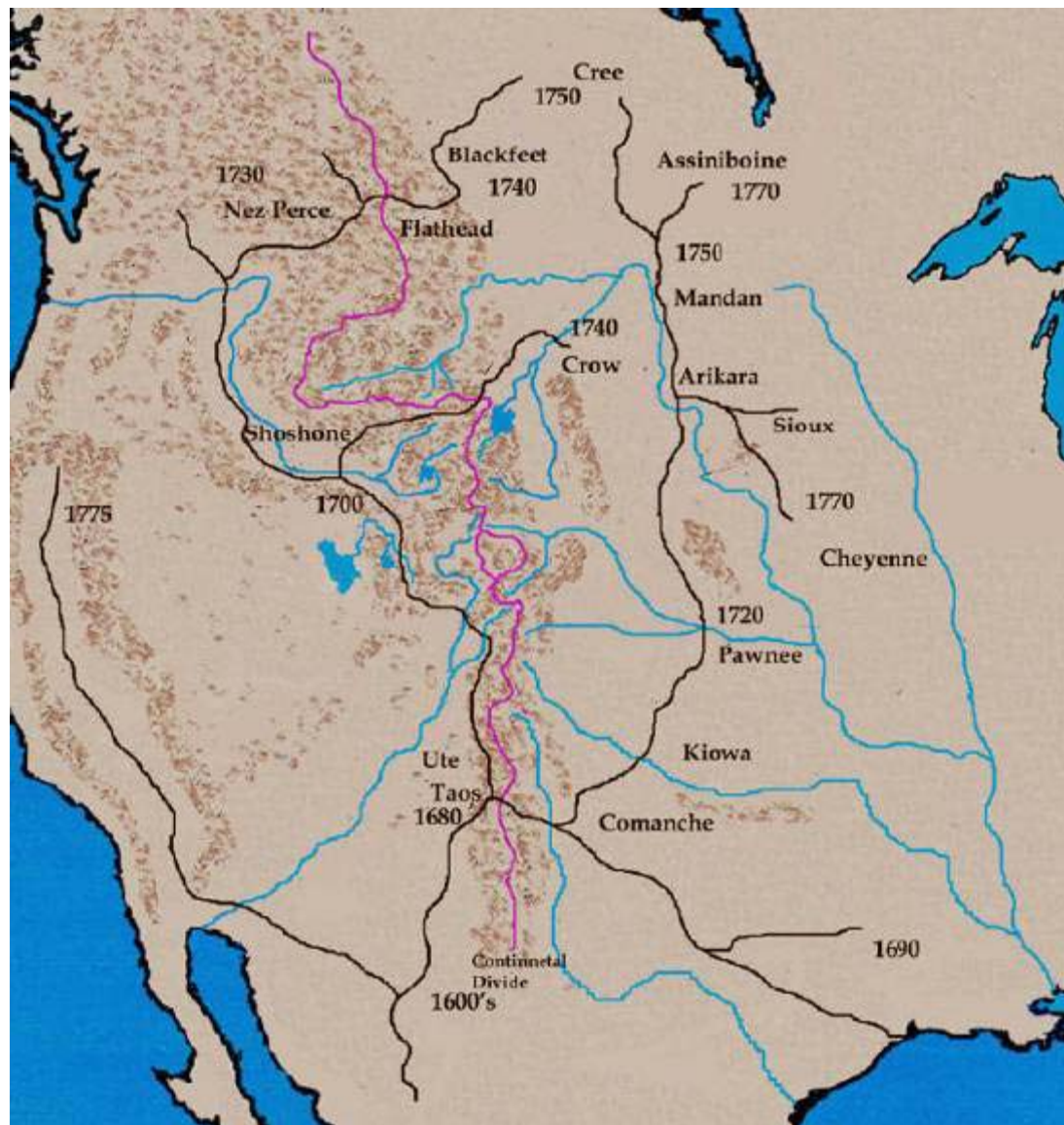


REGIONS OF PREDOMINANTLY LOW RAINFALL



WHITE AREAS SHOW AVERAGE YEARLY RAINFALL OF 20" OR LESS






















