The The Big Pryor Mountain, the Punch Bowl, Bear Canyon, and Lost Water Canyon designated as Wilderness would preserve those things I mentioned. I believe while in the Pryors that Back Country use is fine for those who want to have an area to recreate but there must be some control or limits to the usage and managed to prevent plant destruction and erosion like has happened recently with over use.
